Descripción general	<p>Apply for funding for research to improve health systems in low and middle-income countries (LMICs). This can be: an exploratory, stand-alone Study; pilot or feasibility work that leads to a large research project in future.</p> <p>This funding is not for disease-specific research. Studies funded through this scheme should be based in LMICs.</p> <p>You must be based at an eligible research organisation in either the UK or an LMIC.</p> <p>We'll fund:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - UK research at 74% of the full economic cost - LMIC research at 100% of the full economic cost. <p>You can include indirect costs in your proposal. Your project can be up to two years long.</p> <p>The nature of this scheme means that we would expect applicants to be predominantly based in LMICs. Funding for co-applicants and collaborators in other regions can be requested, but we would expect that the majority of funds would support the costs in the LMIC where the research will be conducted.</p> <p>The purpose of this scheme is to provide funding for the best proposals to generate new knowledge to strengthen and improve health systems in LMICs.</p> <p>The programme's aims are to fund methodologically rigorous, high-quality interdisciplinary research that will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - generate evidence on: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ the structure and dynamics of health systems. ○ how to strengthen and improve health systems for people living in LMICs through the delivery of evidence-based interventions or structural changes (for example,

- strengthening governance, management, health workforce or supply chain).
- provide evidence that is of direct relevance to decision makers and practitioners in the field, linking health systems with defined outcomes (for example health, confidence or financial protection).
- demonstrate an appreciation of current theories and frameworks in health systems research or other social or political science theory of relevance to health systems.
- where focused on a particular aspect of the health system, proposals must demonstrate how interventions relate to and affect wider elements of the system, such as governance, financing, health workforce, information systems or service delivery.

The HSRI scheme remains primarily a mechanism to support large research projects exploring big, new ideas. However, we recognise that preliminary work is often needed in order for applicants to develop innovative partnerships and proposals. **Foundation grants** are smaller and shorter, and can be either:

- exploratory, for example, retrospective, diagnostic analyses looking into existing health systems, investigating the underlying causes beneath perceived problems or to explore possible health system innovations, under-researched areas or creative approaches that have the potential to be developed further.
- small standalone research studies that will generate outputs and impact.
- to conduct pilot work to build the necessary knowledge and methodological base to support a future full proposal, which could include work to pilot an intervention, feasibility or preliminary work to conceptualise broader research questions on the health system.

Please note: funding is available for research only. We will not fund the routine delivery of health services.

We're looking for research projects that will develop practical solutions to health challenges. This includes: late-stage intervention development; implementation science; scale-up activities; health services research; health economics; health policy research; research with a predominantly applied focus that does not fit within the remit of other MRC boards and panels.</p> <p>We also welcome cross-sectoral research that combines expertise to meet a global health challenge (such as urban planning, health policy and non-communicable disease research) within a single proposal.</p> <p>The research question might involve different disciplines and approaches from outside the health sector, but the primary objective must be health focused. Applied research into understanding the effects of COVID-19 in LMICs will be funded through this board.</p> <p>We will accept proposals of all sizes, including large applications over £1 million and small to medium-scale applications. We will take into account value for money when assessing proposals.</p> <p>You can apply for funding to address any health topic of relevance in the context where the research will be conducted.</p>

The Global Health Research Units and Global Health Research Groups offer is unique for NIHR in that it provides funding to support not only delivery of research that will improve health outcomes for people living in LMICs, but also strengthens crucial research capability and capacity in resource-poor settings, in particular, training and capacity-building in both academic research and programme support functions. Together these provide a vital and sustainable platform for future research in those countries.</p> <p>Global Health Research Units are defined as a well-established research partnership or network of universities and research institutes in LMICs and the UK.</p> <p>Through this call, awards up to £7 million over a period of up to 5 years are available to NIHR Global Health Research Units. The amount requested and the length of the funding period should be fully justified according to the nature of the proposed research.</p> <p>Applications must clearly describe the proposed way these funds will be made available for delivery of ODA-eligible research in LMICs. Funds must be spent in LMICs to deliver research. This IKI funding programme aims to support developing and transition economies manage the Covid-19 pandemic. The first phase of this two-stage selection procedure is designed as a competition for entrants worldwide, with ideas about projects for climate action and biodiversity conservation in developing and countries in transition.</p> <p>Developing and countries in transition have been especially hard hit by the social and economic consequences of the coronavirus pandemic. The slogan for the new funding round is therefore ‘Creating Green Societies in Challenging Times’, which reflects that the funding is to support these countries handle the crisis. A consortium does not necessarily need to include a German organisation. You may apply without a consortium under funding priorities 10 and 11, provided the amount of funding being requested is under seven million euros. Applying without a consortium is also an option under funding priorities 12 and 13.</p> <p>There is no limit to the number of outlines an individual organisation can be involved in, nor to</p>
